Dear Sir/Madam:

I am writing to inform you that the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) has, on this date, initiated investigations, under the *Special Import Measures Act* (SIMA) into the alleged injurious dumping and subsidizing of certain cold-rolled steel in coils or cut lengths from China, South Korea and Vietnam.

Although goods originating in your country are not subject to these investigations, I am informing you of this decision as there are indications that some goods subject to these investigations have been sold to importers in Canada by exporters located in your country. Notice of the initiation of the investigations is hereby given pursuant to subparagraph 34(1)(a)(i) of SIMA.

A *Statement of Reasons*, which summarizes the information on which this decision was based and which describes, in general terms, the future activities related to the investigations, will be available within 15 days on the CBSA's website at: www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca/sima.

The exporters of record located in your country will be contacted in order to obtain the information necessary to determine the normal value and the export price of the goods shipped to Canada.

You should also be aware that it might be necessary for officers of the CBSA to visit exporters and/or producers of the subject goods located in your country to verify information provided by them during the investigations. In such an eventuality, you will be notified in advance of these visits.
